Chess in Schools Program Continues to Grow

This fall launched the second year for the Cris Collinsworth ProScan Fund's Chess in Schools Program. Chess in Schools is committed to providing social and academic enrichment to students through the game of chess. Nearly 30 countries have embraced chess as a beneficial educational tool by offering it in public schools. Similarly, schools in New York, St. Louis, and Seattle have incorporated chess into their curricula. Thanks to grant funding from The Woodward Trust, CCPF was able to expand the Chess in Schools Program and is now teaching in 15 schools to approximately 380 students each week in Greater Cincinnati.

"My students love playing chess! Students that rarely participate in class are raising their hands to answer higher level thinking questions. Students are improving their problem solving skills through the game of chess and can be seen using these same skills in math class."
