- Tani Adewumi, Our Shining Knight Award Recipient

We are coming up on the 19th Annual Queen City Classic! The QCC chess tournament will be held on February 28th and 29th, 2020 at Paul Brown Stadium. We are delighted to see this event grow and include so many young people in Cincinnati and beyond. Chess instruction is a brilliant way to encourage and empower children to develop vital skills such as critical thinking, strategy, self esteem and good sportsmanship. Chess starts and ends with a handshake and provides an equal playing field for all from all backgrounds.

Every year, the Shining Knight Award is presented to deserving individuals who demonstrate a strong commitment to improving the lives of others. We will honor Tani Adewumi as 2020's Shining Knight Award recipient. A Nigerian refugee and only 8 year's old, Tani learned to play chess living in a homeless shelter in Manhattan. Tani's school chess club waived the fee for Tani to join. That year, Tani won the New York State Scholastic Primary Championship at just 8 years old. After his story went viral including a feature in the New York Times, a GoFundMe was set up to raise money for his family. Tani gave a portion of the more than \$200,000 raised to the church that had helped his family and used the remainder to set up the Tani Adewumi Foundation to assist other African refugees in the United States. Tani is a valuable member and advocate of the chess community.









CCPF AND XAVIER UNIVERSITY PARTNERSHIP UPDATE

In our second year of partnership with Xavier University, we are excited to continue the freshman chess seminar, The Game of Chess. The seminar is designed to teach chess but also to provide in depth examination of topics such as literature as seen through chess



analogy. The seminar is instilling a love of the game and furtherance of chess culture at Xavier and the younger generation in Cincinnati. We have also expanded this year to include a chess club at the Xavier Montessori School. Xavier students receive valuable insight by observing teaching techniques, as children learn the game of chess.

FLAME EVENT AT XAVIER UNIVERSITY

Xavier chess students presented their final projects at an event called FLAME: A Celebration of Freshman Student Research at the CINTAS Center. Students gave presentations on various topics as they related to chess including literature, AI etc. It is rewarding to see freshman students' work as they explore broad and narrow discussions as applied to the game of chess.

PREP OUTREACH

CCPF actively engages in the community with educational outreach through our Pink Ribbon Empowerment Program (PREP). Brittany Buckman, Pink Ribbon Programs Liaison, engaged in 33 outreach events in 2019 through our community partners including Catholic Charities and Health Gap. During these events and health fairs, the community is educated on breast cancer awareness and the importance of knowing the early warning signs as well as self breast exam procedures. Should someone be in need of a mammogram or breast ultrasound, we can coordinate scheduling the visit at one of our 3 ProScan Pink Ribbon Centers while at the event. PREP also provides the opportunity to help people apply for our Mammogram Match program which provides free breast imaging to patients who qualify.

Early detection is key to saving lives. It is meaningful to us that we can provide these services to the community and give patients a better chance at survival. We also connect patients with valuable resources such as our Survivor Circle and Cruisin' for a Cure program, providing transportation services through our partners at Performance LEXUS.
